The Warship Is Now Being Repaired as Rapidly as Possible at Woo Sung.

Shanghai, Aug. 14.-Evening.-It is expected that the Russian protected cruiser Askold, which arrived at Woo Sung on Aug. 12, will dock tonight.

A correspondent of the Associated Press went to the Askold today for the purpose of inspecting her, but at first it seemed impossible to obtain permission to do so. The sentry at the gangway answered every request to come on board with a stern refusal, no matter in what language the request was couched. Finally appeal was made to Capt. Gammatchikoff, who with the consent of Capt. Seiberstein, gave permission for the correspondent to come on board.

On reaching the deck of the cruiser everything was found to be in confusion and it was noticed that no attempt had been made to put things in shipshape.
