WIPE OUT 30,000 **ENGLISH SALOONS**

British Government's Licensing Bill Is Far Reaching.

REDUCTION IS PROGRESSIVE

Asquith Says the Ultimate Intention Is for the State to Recover the

Monopoly of Liquor Traffic.

London, Feb. 27.-Chancellor of the Exchequer Asquith introduced the licensing bill in the House of Commons this afternoon. This is the principal Government measure for the present session of Parliament. The capital invested in licensed property in this country is about \$1,200,000,000 Briefly, the bill provides for the compulsory reduction within a specified period, and on a uniform scale of the number of saloons licensed throughout the country. In cities it is proposed to allow one saloon for every 750 persons, and in the country districts one saloon for every 400 persons. This regulation, it is estimated, will wipe out in the neighborhood of 30,000 licenses, about one-third of

the present total. The bill proposes that this reduction e affected within twenty years. Local option is to govern the issuance of Mr. Graham's Bill Legalizing new licenses, and a majority of the parochial electors is sufficient to pro-
