GENERAL MACKENZIE

ADVISOR TO MINISTER

Reported That He Has Been Appointed

Chief of Canadian Staff.

London, Aug. 16.—Major-General

J. Colin MacKenzie, C. B., has been ap-

pointed chief of the Canadian general

staff and first military adviser to the

Canadian minister of militia. He is

now in command of the sixth infantry

brigade.

The position of chief of the general

staff at present is General Otter, and

the above cable would seem to confirm

the rumor at Ottawa that he is to suc-

ceed General Sir Percy Lake as in-

spector-general of the Canadian forces.

General Lake, in addition to being

inspector-general, is first military ad-

viser to the minister of militia. It is

presumed that General Otter will be

required to devote all his time to the

work of inspector-general, while Gen-

eral MacKenzie will be adviser to the

minister.
