SUPERVISION ADVISABLE

OF REAL EXERCISE

Mayor-Elect Wenige Appeals For Co-operation From City Bodies.

Charging the business and professional men of London with responsibility for the physical development of future generations, Dr. George Smith, physical director of Western University, in an address today before the chamber of commerce, stated that city fathers should awaken to the necessity of muscular activity for themselves as well as for their chil-

The benefits of supervised physical training were treated in some detail. Dr. Smith claimed that millions of premature deaths among young bus-inessmen could be attributed to over-brainwork without a corresponding amount of physical exercise. Dr. Lewis of London, England, a famous nerve specialist, states that every man should get the equivalent of 10 miles of walking in exercise every day. Persons engaged in work that taxes the mind are subject to greater physical impairment than laborers. Consequently such people should habituate themselves to the practice of acquiring muscular activity daily.

Thus the normal excretions from the Thus the normal excretions from the skin, lungs, kidneys, etc., would be well take care of, the muscles hardened and general health immensely improved. Few men, however, appreciate this essential and pay the price in ill-health and periodical break-downs.

Experiences of American army offi-cials revealed that only 60 per cent of applicants for service were physically fit. Poor environment, lack of exercise and malnutrition were responsible for this condition. The ma-jority of anatomical disorders could be righted through the practice of daily exercises equal to a ten-mile


