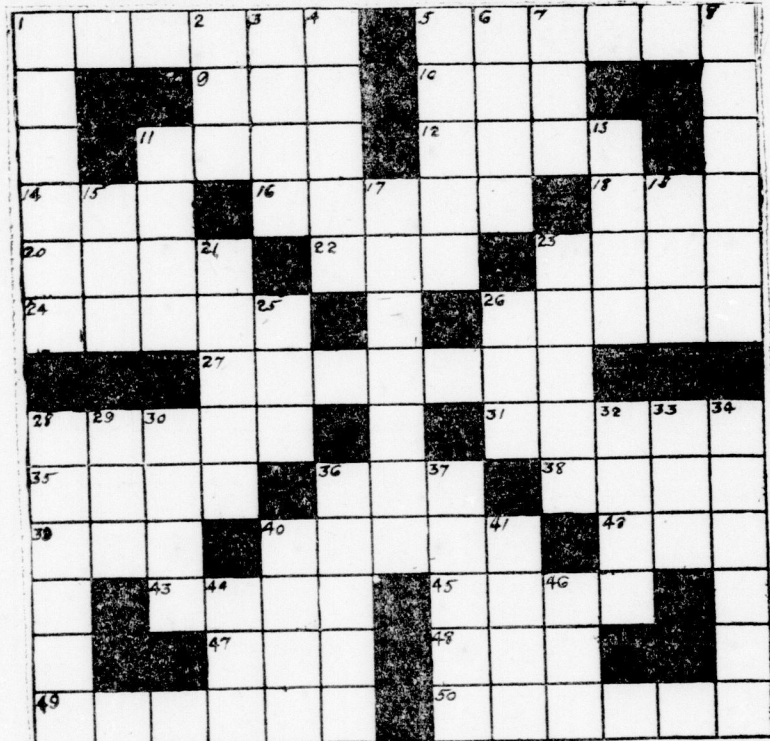

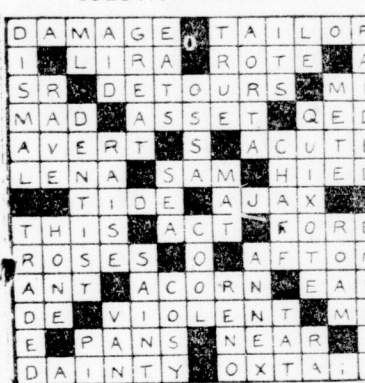

LIONS CLUB PLANS PARK BANDSTAND

Committee of Six Named To Raise \$12,000 For Gift To City.

London Lions Club will build a bandstand in Victoria Park this year, if the gods of fortune and the united concentration and effort of the club can manage it. Last night at the weekly dinner, it was unanimously decided to proceed with this scheme, and a committee was appointed to make the necessary steps to raise the \$12,000 required. This committee consists of Cyril Thomas, Bill Baines, Fred Barricks, Max Griffiths, Will Lashbrook, James Orme and Dr. Hugh Stevenson.

Fuel Issue Discussed.
Canada's fuel problem will also be taken up by the club if the suggestion of Ernie Hines to this effect is followed. Mr. Hines spoke last night on the coal situation in Canada, and urged the Lions club to make it one of their service objectives. Hope was expressed that when the fuel situation was thoroughly investigated a united delegation of all the Lions clubs in the dominion would wait on the premier and demand Canadian coal for Canadians.

It was announced during the evening that two new Lions clubs had been opened in Ontario within the last week, and that the organization has now four more clubs in Canada than either the Kiwanis or the Rotary.

Speaking on Western coal, Mr. Hines declared that politicians in 1918, when leases of the western fields then owned by an American had run out, had refused the offer of a British firm at one million dollars more, and had given them to certain Torontonians. He said the British firm had offered to develop the fields to a larger extent than had been carried out since.

More Money To Spend.
"If more coal is produced in the Canadian West," he said, "it is sold to its logical market in the American west, then our farmers will have more money to spend in manufacturing Ontario. 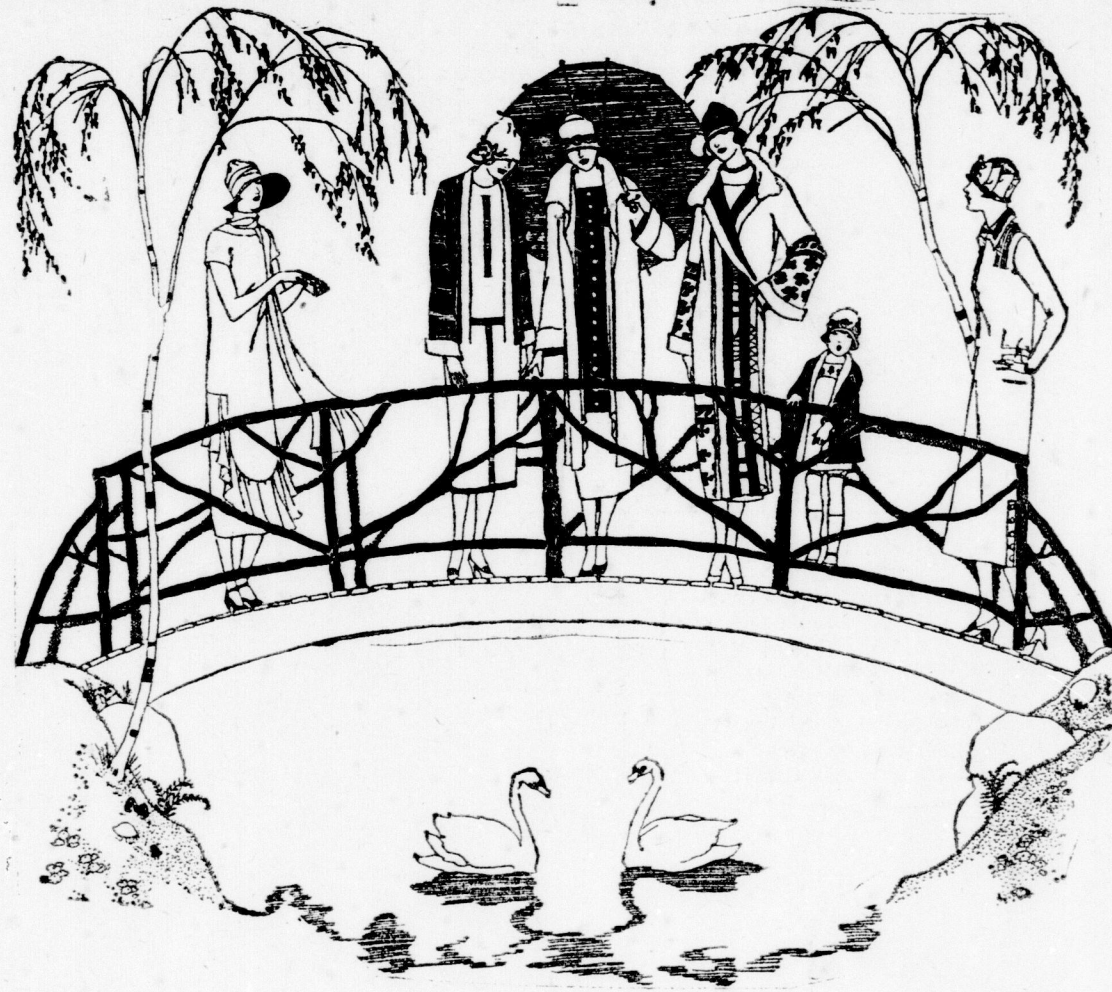

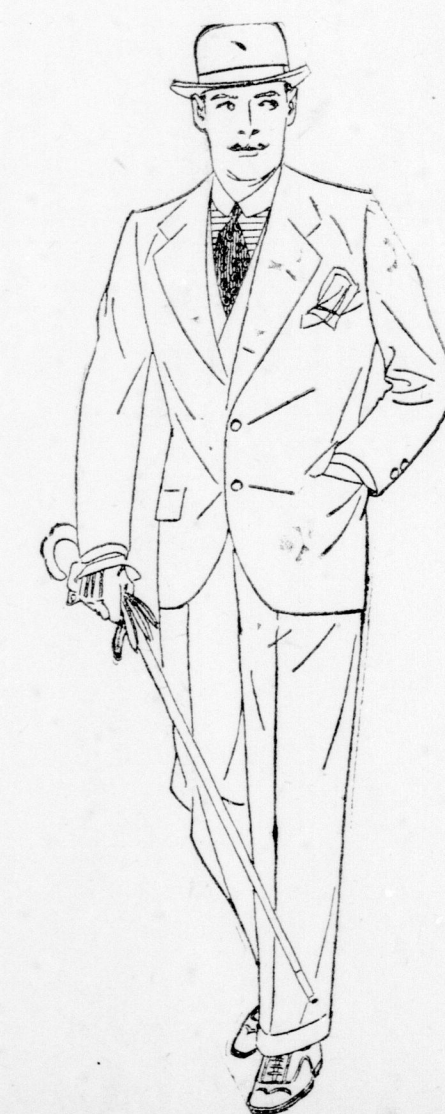
