Miss Hilda Keith of Montreal has received a letter from England in reference to her brother, Merle. Pte. Keith was formerly of Campbellton but enlisted in Montreal.

The Limes London, Eng.

My Dear Hilda

This is my first opportunity to answer your very welcome letter received safely last Saturday morning. I also received two from Merle the first for over three weeks. You can imagine I was thinking and wondering all kinds of things concerning him and was more than relieved to find it was nothing worse than that he had been in hospital with concussion. A shell came over where he was and lifted him about fifteen feet up into the air and he knew nothing more until he woke up in hospital two days afterwards.

Shortly afterwards I made up a parcel to post to him and did not get it off and am very glad I did not for on Sunday evening who should come in but Merle himself. We were very surprised to see him. He is looking very well considering the facts except that he looks about three years older instead of one. It is exactly a year and one week since he left our place and his present pass is up on Feb. 20th so he is returning to France just a year to date.

It is too bad really for we were right in the midst of the Munitions area where the explosion took place which occurred on the 19th of January. Our house is a total wreck with the exception of the kitchen. The roof was off and all the windows out but we have managed to get the front bedroom fixed up so with a little contrivance we are O. K. until we move
