An old-Time Canoe. An interesting relic of the past has just been unearthed in the parish of Pul-borough, Sussex, in the shape of a canoe, which was partly embedded under the borough, Sussex, in the shape of a cance, which was partly embedded under the river Arun, and partly in the land on the south side of that river. 



