SARATOGA RACES.

Notwithstan ing the continued racing in the East ever since the Washington meeting in May, and the slight counterattraction at Bighton Beach, the old established fixture at Saratoga has secured no less than 800 horses from all scotions of the country to take part in the annual gathering which began on the 17th just. Since the 1879 meeting at the famous Springs, a number of improvements and alterations have been made in the grand stands and other structures with the evident intention of keeping Saratoga up to the mark, compared with the rewiracks near New York. As usual pool selling was carried on, but that did not prevent the book-makers doing a good business, their system permitting of speedier investments, and the selection of outsiders, instead of having to purchase a field ticket a shorter rate of olds.
