"THE LIBERAL CHRISTIAN."

Just ten years have now elapsed since the first attempt was made in Montreal, and so far as we know in Canada, to issue a periodical publication identified with the interests of a liberal form of Christianity. At that time the Unitarian Congregation of this city was in the critical period of early infancy, and the friends of that movement were impressed with the necessity of having some printed exponent of their views, in order to correct the misapprehension which then so generally existed as to their true character. To meet this want, the Committee of the Montreal Unitarian Society commenced the issue of a monthly sheet, called the Bible Christian, as the exponent of Unitarian principles. We write this paragraph with the first number of the Bible Christian before us, from which it appears that it was set on foot to serve a temporary and local purpose.
