

FINAL ACT OF THE THIRD
UNITED NATIONS TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE CONFERENCE

I. The General Assembly, at its 389th plenary meeting of 28 October 1952, requested the President to appoint a Negotiating Committee for Extra-Budgetary Funds for the purpose of consulting with Member and non-Member States as to the amount which Governments might be willing to contribute on a voluntary basis towards the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance. The General Assembly decided further that upon the request of the Committee the Secretary-General should arrange an appropriate meeting of Member and non-Member States at which they should be invited to make known. On 12 November 1952 the Committee requested the Secretary-General to convene a meeting at which Governments would announce their contributions to the Expanded Programme of Technical Assistance for the third financial period ending 31 December 1953. Accordingly, the Secretary-General convened the Third United Nations Technical Assistance Conference.

2. The Third United Nations Technical Assistance Conference met at Headquarters on 26 February 1953. The Governments of the following States were represented at the Conference:
