DreamWorks Feature Animation is a state-of-the-art animation studio housing the development and production of animated features. DreamWorks currently has four projects in production: "The Prince of Egypt" (release: November, 1998), "The Road to El Dorado" (release: 1999), "Antz" (release: 1999 and is a full CGI production in progress at Pacific Data Images – PDI), "Shrek" (release: 2000).

In the spring of 1998, construction of the 13 acre Glendale DreamWorks Animation Campus will be complete. This location will serve as the main studio for the feature and television animation divisions. Phase one of construction includes five buildings encompassing 320,000 square feet of office space.

The DreamWorks Animation Campus was the vision of noted architect Steven Ehrlich and was "designed by artists for artists". The campus exhibits a Mediterranean-influenced design with heavy landscaping, several courtyards and a man-made stream, providing a truly congenial, user-friendly work environment. Staff began to occupy the facility in mid-December 1997.

## Management

DreamWorks desires to maintain 100% of the production in-house, to guarantee quality. The effect of international business on operations will be minimal, at least for the foreseeable future.
