(A) INTERNATIONAL NEGOTIATIONS AND AGREEMENTS

1. The following acts of the International Civil Aviation Conference held at Chicago from November 1st to December 7th, 1944, have been signed by Canada:
 1. Final Act.
 2. Interim Agreement on International Civil Aviation.
 3. Convention on International Civil Aviation (Signed subject to ratification).
 4. International Air Services Transit Agreement.
2. Convention modifying the International Sanitary Convention signed at Paris on June 21, 1926, open for signature at Washington on December 15, 1944, and signed for Canada on January 15, 1945, subject to ratification.
3. Convention modifying the International Sanitary Convention for Aerial Navigation signed at The Hague on April 12, 1933, open for signature at Washington on December 15, 1944, and signed for Canada on January 15, 1945, subject to ratification.
4. Exchange of Notes between Canada and the United States concerning the post-war disposition of United States defence projects in Canada, (Washington November 22, December 20, 1944).
5. Exchange of Notes between Canada and the United States constituting an agreement concerning the acquisition of land for United States defence projects in Canada, Ottawa, December 28/30, 1944.

(B) OFFICIAL STATEMENTS AND RELEASES
CONCERNING EXTERNAL RELATIONS

1. Statement on the reopening of travel to "the interior zone" of France for Canadian business men and accredited newspaper representatives - press release of January 5, 1945.
2. Announcement of the presentation of credentials by the Honourable W.F.A. Turgeon, Ambassador designate to Belgium, as Canadian Minister to Luxembourg - press release of January 5, 1945.
3. Announcement of a dinner given by the Prime Minister to members of the diplomatic corps on behalf of the Government of Canada, on the occasion of the impending departure from Canada of Baron Silvercruys, Belgian Ambassador, Dr. Grove, Chilean Ambassador, and Sir William Glasgow, High Commissioner for Australia - press release of January 12, 1945.
4. Announcement by the Prime Minister that Canada would participate in setting up a Commonwealth Air Transport Council - press release of January 15, 1945.
5. Statement on Canada's acceptance of the Interim Agreement on International Civil Aviation drawn up at the International Civil Aviation Conference in Chicago - press release of January 18, 1945.
6. Joint statement by the President of the United States and the Prime Ministers of the United Kingdom and Canada on the decision to maintain the Combined Boards until the end of Japanese war - press release of January 19, 1945.
