THE DEPARTMENT OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE FOUR SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED TO THE CANADIAN GOVERNMENT BY THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 1958-59 HAVE BEEN AWARDED TO MISS LORENE BATLEY OF PETERBOROUGH, ONTARIO, AND MESSRS. ROBERT CHARLES CULLEY, JOHN DOUGLAS AND HENRY WALTON, ALL OF TORONTO.

THE SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES WERE SELECTED BY THE AWARDS COMMITTEE OF THE ROYAL SOCIETY OF CANADA IN CO-OPERATION WITH THE EMBASSY OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY. EACH SCHOLARSHIP IS VALUED AT 4,200 DM (ABOUT \$980 CANADIAN) AND INCLUDES FREE TUITION AND FREE RETURN TRANSPORTATION BETWEEN THE GERMAN BORDER AND THE PLACE OF STUDY IN GERMANY.

MISS LORENE BATLEY STUDIED AT THE PETERBOROUGH COLLEGIATE AND VOCATIONAL SCHOOL AND IS NOW IN HER SECOND YEAR OF ARTS AT QUEEN'S UNIVERSITY. IN GERMANY, SHE WILL TAKE COURSES IN THE GERMAN AND FRENCH LANGUAGES.

MR. ROBERT CHARLES CULLEY RECEIVED HIS B.A. DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO IN 1955 AND IS AT PRESENT STUDYING FOR THE DEGREE OF BACHELOR OF DIVINITY AT KNOX COLLEGE. HE WILL CONTINUE HIS STUDIES IN ORIENTAL LANGUAGES AT THE UNIVERSITY OF BONN.

MR. JOHN DOUGLAS HOLDS AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE IN SPEECH, ARTS AND DRAMA FROM THE ROYAL CONSERVATORY OF MUSIC IN TORONTO AND IS A FINAL YEAR STUDENT IN PHILOSOPHY AND ENGLISH AT VICTORIA COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO. MR DOUGLAS WILL STUDY HISTORY OF THE THEATRE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MUNICH AND IN BONN AND WILL ALSO HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO GAIN PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE IN MODERN GERMAN STAGE PRODUCTION.

THE FOURTH AWARD RECIPIENT, MR. HENRY WALTON, WAS BORN IN FRANKFURT, GERMANY, AND RECEIVED HIS B.A. DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO IN 1956. HE IS CURRENTLY PREPARING AT THE SAME UNIVERSITY A M.A. THESIS IN POLITICAL SCIENCE AND WILL CONTINUE TO STUDY IN THIS FIELD IN GERMANY.
