By Mr. Argue:—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for a copy of all letters, telegrams, memorandum and other documents exchanged between the Government of Canada, or any Department or Agency thereof, and the Government of Saskatchewan, the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool, the Saskatchewan Federation of Agriculture, The Saskatchewan Farmers' Union, and local farm co-operatives, between September 1, 1951 and February 28, 1952, relative to: (a) the importation and use of portable grain dryers; (b) the shipment of damp grain to terminal dryers by farmers and elevator companies.

By Mr. Diefenbaker:—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for a copy of all communications that passed between veterinary officials either Provincial or Federal and the Federal Department of Agriculture, together with all records since the 17th day of November, 1951, relative to the cattle epidemic of vesicular stomatitis or foot-and-mouth disease in Saskatchewan, also all certificates or statements of analysis showing the results of the chemical examination of suspected specimens of either of said cattle diseases.

By Mr. Wright:—Order of the House for a copy of any agreement entered into by the government providing for the leasing or expropriation of petroleum or natural gas rights on Indian Reserves in the Province of Saskatchewan.

By Mr. Knowles:—Address to His Excellency the Governor General for a copy of all correspondence between the Prime Minister and/or the Government of Canada and the Premier and/or the Government of Manitoba, dated since June 1, 1950, with reference to compensation to home owners for damages to their property or losses sustained by reason of the construction of dykes against possible future flooding of the Red River.

By Mr. Low:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence exchanged between the Post Office Department and persons resident in Guysboro County, Nova Scotia, relative to mail contract between Fishermans Harbour and Port Hillford, in the year 1951.
