(Millions of Barrels)



3. Oil and Gas in the NWT Economy

The NWT is 3.4 million km² or one third of Canada's area. There are fewer than 50,000 inhabitants and the population is predominantly native. The NWT has nearly 10% of the world's fresh water. Nine percent of the land mass is forested. Over two million hectars of land is believed to be suitable for some form of agriculture. In excess of three thousand people engage in commercial fur production. Traditional arts and crafts provide an important source of income for small communities. The tourism industry is a major employer. Government is the largest single employer with the communications and service sector in second place.
