

Toronto Police Department, conducted a search on July 5, 1969 under authority of a Writ of Assistance issued pursuant to the Customs Act.

2. Charges were not laid under the Customs Act. Subsequently charges were preferred by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department under Section 150 of the Criminal Code of Canada.

3. A total of 4,255 magazines, bearing 13 different titles, and 544—100 feet 8 m.m. films, bearing 20 different titles, were placed under Customs detention pursuant to the Customs Act. The value of the magazines and films was not determined as they were not appraised by Customs.

4. The magazines and films placed under Customs detention were retained by the RCMP from July 5, 1969 until December 10, 1969. The Metropolitan Toronto Police Department was permitted, for a short time, to take possession of the magazines and films for examination concerning the proposed Criminal Code prosecution.

5. Representation was made for return of the magazines and films by Legal Counsel on behalf of the magazine distributor on December 1, 1969. The magazines and films were returned to the magazine distributor by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police on December 10, 1969. Samples of the magazines and films placed under Customs detention by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police were forwarded on August 26, 1969, to the Department of National Revenue, Ottawa, for a ruling under Tariff Item 99201-1. A ruling was not given by the Department in view of the prosecution under Section 150 of the Criminal Code of Canada by the Metropolitan Toronto Police Department.

Superannuation Regulations, and effective with the quarter ending September 30, 1969 the interest factor changed in accordance with the schedule outlined in T.B. Minute 692055-2.
