## Government Orders

Hon. Jean Lapierre (Shefford): Mr. Speaker, I would point out to you that you have not requested unanimous consent yet and that I have the privilege of denying it. However, as a sign of our willingness to contribute to the good cause of helping Canadian families, especially in Quebec, and in a spirit of co-operation that I wish were a two-way street for the leaders of the other parties—I would like them to remember this gesture of support in other circumstances—I will also give consent.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. DeBlois): So, to make sure it is clear to everyone, is there unanimous consent for the approval at all stages of bills C-81, C-82, C-73 and C-86?

Some hon. members: No.

An hon, member: Oh, oh!

The Acting Speaker (Mr. DeBlois): Attention, please! I believe I worded the question incorrectly. Is there unanimous consent for adopting today bills C-81, C-82 and C-73 at second reading and bill C-86 at all stages?

Some hon, members: No.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. DeBlois): The hon. opposition House leader has the floor.

Mr. Jean-Robert Gauthier (Ottawa—Vanier): Mr. Speaker, on the proposal of the government, that motion will not be debated. It will be agreed unanimously if the government is willing to put it and to adopt the motion in order to pass Bills C-81, C-82, C-73 and C-86 today.

## APPOINTMENT OF A PORT WARDEN FOR THE HARBOUR OF QUEBEC

MEASURE TO AMEND
