- Question: What are the levels of service provided to immigrants to ensure that the monies loaned to them are not lost through dealings with unscrupulous individuals who might prey on immigrants?
- Response: Canada uses, wherever possible, the services of the International Organization for Migration (IOM) to make travel arrangements for persons who require a transportation loan to travel to Canada. IOM organized the travel to Canada of some 33,000 refugees and immigrants last year. Because IOM arranges travel for refugees going to a number of countries, it is able to obtain discounts of 40% to 50% on transportation costs. These discounts are passed directly to the refugees in that the transportation loans to them reflect the reduced travel costs.

IOM is a well recognised international organization, which comprises some 36 member states and 16 observer states. IOM was founded on December 5, 1951 as a nonpolitical organization with a predominately operational mandate. IOM's main functions include the handling of orderly and planned migration to meet the specific needs of emigration and immigration countries; the processing and movement of refugees and displaced persons; the transfer of qualified human resources to promote the socio-economic advancement of developing countries; and, the provision of a politically nonaligned forum for the exchange of views and experiences on international migration issues.

Since 1952, IOM has assisted over 4 million persons (3 million refugees and 1 million national migrants) to move to countries offering them permanent resettlement or other opportunities for orderly migration. Canada is a member of IOM and is thus able to use fully the services provided by this organization for the benefit of refugees and immigrants coming to Canada.
