My dear Sir Arthur: I have your letter of the 3rd instant, enclosing a copy of one addressed to Major General J. H. MacBrien, C.B., C.M.G., D.S.O., asking for the cooperation of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in the Arctic in connection with proposed studies in the Department of Parasitology and Helminthology at Macdonald College. It is thought that this proposal might be advantageously discussed by the Inter-departmental Advisory Board on Wild Life Protection and a meeting has been arranged for Friday, the 19th instant. An invitation has been sent to Dr. Cameron to attend. I am also having an item placed on the Agenda for the next session of the Northwest Territories Council, which will be held in two or three weeks' time.
