

107. Being in Column of Sections to Form Line to the Front.

On the Left (or Right) Form Preceptory.—On the word PRECEPTORY, the leading section steps short. All other sections incline to the left (or right) and march in this direction until they unmask their leading section, when each section will advance and form in line on the left (or right) of the leading section.

Forward.—When line is formed. "Forward."

108. Being in Column of Sections to March to the Right (or Left) in Column of Threes or Squads.

Column of Threes (or Squads) to the—Right (or Left).—On the word RIGHT, the section commander of the leading section commands . . . "section threes (or squads) right (or left)." Each succeeding section will execute the same movement on the same ground by the same commands from their section commander.

109. Being in Column of Sections, to March to the Left (or Right) in Column of Half Preceptories.

Column of Half Preceptories to the Left (or Right).—On the word LEFT (or RIGHT), the senior subaltern commands, "right half Preceptory sections left (or right)" and continues the march in the new direction. The left half Preceptory executes the same movement on the same ground, covering the right half Preceptory, the junior subaltern, giving the same commands.

110. Being in Column of Sections, to Form Line to the Left (or Right).

Line to the Left (or Right). Sections Left (or Right)—Wheel.—On the word WHEEL, each section wheels to the left (or right) into line.
