foon as they should receive Intelligence that his Majesty's Ships had entered the River S. Lawrence, and form the Siege of that Place.e

As to the particular Number of Men to b raifed in any of the Provinces, that was no limited by his Majesty; but it was fignified in his Instructions to his Governors, that his Majesty hoped the Troops, which should be raised in the several Colonies, would amount in the whole to at least 5000.

Whilft Preparations were making in England and the British Colonies in North America for profecuting this Enterprize, the French were employed in fitting out an Armament from Brest and the West Indies, which, in Conjunction with a Body of Land Forces to be raised in Canada, was defined for the Reduction of Nova Scotia.

The Quota's of Troops raifed in the feveral Colonies concerned in the Expedition against Canada were as follows; the Mallachufets Bay, which is ever the leading Province in all Enterprizes for his Majerty's Service and the common Caufe, fet the first Example upon this important Occasion; and notwithstanding it had loft near 2000 of its fighting Men in the Service of the preceding Year, granted a Bounty for encouraging the inlifting of 3500, with fuch a Sum as should be necessary for defraying the Expence of Transports and Provisions for them : A Bounty was given by the Province of New York for enlifting 1600; by the Colony of Connecticut for 1000; by Nerg L 2

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
