AN ACT

To incorporate the Lockport and Niagara Falls
Rail-road Company.

Passed April 24, 1834.

The People of the State of New-York, represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

§ 1. All persons who shall become Stockholders pursuant to this Act, shall be and they are hereby constituted a body Corporate, by the name of the "Lockport and Niagara Falls Rail-road Company," with power to construct a single or double Rail-road, commencing in the village of Lockport, and running from thence on the most eligible route to the village at or near the Niagara Falls, to transport, take and carry persons and property upon the same, by the power and force of animals, or of any mechanical power, or of any combination of them which the said Company may choose to employ; and by that name they are vested with the right and privilege of erecting, building and making a single or double Rail-road for the purpose aforesaid, and the right of using the same in the manner hereinafter directed, for and during

the term of fifty years.

§ 2. If the said Corporation hereby created, shall not Timelimited. within two years from the passage of this Act, commence the construction of said Rail-road, and expend at least the sum of fifty thousand dollars thereon, and shall not, within five years from the passage of this Act, finish and put in operation the said single or double Rail-road or ways, then the said Corporation shall thenceforth forever cease, and this Act shall be null and void.
