The great work of Gibbon embraces a long and interesting period of history, respecting which the English reader has few other sources of information. The vast amount of facts which it embodies, and their skillful exhibition, will always render it a popular work; while its obscenity, its false colorings, and its perpetual sneers at the Christian religion, make it, to the young especially, a dangerous one.

It is a little remarkable that the task of reviewing this book thoroughly, of exposing its plausible but unfair reasonings, and of correcting its errors, should first be undertaken by a Frenchman and a civilian. This edition, with ample corrections, was first prepared in Paris, in 1812, by M. Guizot, who has since so highly distinguished himself as a minister of state, and the head of one of the political parties in France.

By means of short notes at the foot of the page, the mistakes of Gibbon are every where corrected, with full references to the authorities by which the facts are ascertained; and his artful assaults on the Christian religion and Christian men are exposed and repelled with the learning of a scholar and the candor of a gentleman. By this means the young may reap the advantages of Gibbon's researches, without danger of being poisoned by his religious prejudices.

Though this is a work of such acknowledged importance and merit, it has never yet appeared in an English dress. The translation of Guizot's notes and corrections by a person every way qualified for the task, has greatly enhanced the value of a work, which, from its first appearance, has been regarded as a standard in English Historical Literature.

Though we should hesitate much before we would put Gibbon, unaccompanied by corrections, into the hands of the young, yet, with the rich additions of so able a critic as M. Guizot, we do cheerfully recommend this edition to extensive circulation.
