

"from the preceding term, and shall obtain from the Bursar a Card of Admission to the School, which shall be presented to the Head Master within the first two weeks of the term.

"And should any boy fail to present such Card within the specified time, it shall be the duty of the Head Master to request his parents to remove him from the School until such payment shall be made."

BOARDING.

Boarders are received into the School-House, a large and commodious building, with accommodation for sixty boys. The School-House is under the immediate supervision of the Head Master, assisted by three resident Masters. The household arrangements are directed by a Lady Matron of acknowledged ability and experience. The grounds, covering eight acres, afford ample room for cricketing, &c., and an open-air Gymnasium has been erected, which with a Fives-court to be built as soon as circumstances allow, will ensure the muscular development of the boys.
