TELEGRAPH BRIEFS

Black leg, leaf roll, mosaic and curly-dwarf are the main diseases found damaging the potatoes. Black leg affects the young potato plants during wet and backward seasons and in poorly drained soils. The disease starts at the root, and in a few days the leaf of the plant droops to the ground.




