**FIFTEEN HUNDRED 'LONGSHOREMEN ARE ON STRIKE IN MONTREAL**

**They Demanded an Increase of Pay Yesterday Morning and Left Work Last Night—Criminal Action May be Taken.**

Montreal, May 13—Fifteen hundred longshoremen are on strike in the port of Montreal. At 6 o'clock this evening they screwed the hatches on the holds of the ocean vessels now in course of unloading in port and quit work quietly.

The trouble came suddenly. There was no breach of dissatisfaction since the season began until the New York strike leaked large on the horizon. Then the men here felt that they were not getting their dues and persuaded, it is said, by agitators who have been in the city from the other side of the border for the last few days, the longshoremen union, a branch of the International Longshoremen's Union, presented an ultimatum to the shipping concerns of Montreal that unless the shipping concerns of Montreal at the end of the strike in 1903 still remained valid and that before 6 o'clock there would be a general strike.

In the morning a letter was sent to the Allan line, the Robert Reford Company, Ltd., (operating the Donatien and Lehigh lines), the Dominion and Leyland lines and the P. R. that the longshoremen of Montreal wanted 35 cents an hour for day work up to 6 o'clock and after that 35 cents an hour for night work up to 6 o'clock and 70 cents after 6 o'clock.

When this demand reached the shipping companies, there was a hurry up meeting of the Shipping Federation called. The federation members met in the rooms of the association at the board of trade building and there were present H. A. Allan, president of the federation; Mr. Gear, of the Reford Company, and Mr. Thom, of the Dominion line.

The meeting lasted for two hours and then broke up, the members positively refusing to make a statement as to what course would be adopted in regard to the ultimatum presented by the longshoremen.

At 6 o'clock no answer had been received by the longshoremen and when the time came for supper, there were pickets at each shed to advise the men not to work after the supper hour.

**OBITUARY**

**Mrs. John I. Willis**

The death of Mrs. John I. Willis, aged 52, took place quite suddenly at Milford Monday. Mrs. Willis had been suffering from a chronic illness for years and on Sunday, May 5, suffered a stroke of paralysis. She never rallied and passed away peacefully. She was born in Lunenburg (N. S.), but had lived in Milford for 23 years.

She was a woman of generous nature and kindly disposition and she will be much missed by all who knew her. Besides her husband she leaves three daughters—Mrs. Thomas Russell, of Milford; Mrs. Robert Ross, of Sussex, and Miss Harriet, at home, and two sons—Arthur, of this city, and John at home.

**Mrs. Charlotte Everett**

Digby, N. S., May 13—(Special)—Mrs. Charlotte Everett died at the home of Mrs. Lauria Meier, Birch street, at 8 o'clock this morning, in the ninety-eighth year of her age. She was highly respected by all who knew her, and her death could be broken by the men there would have to be an official notification by the men that a rearrangement of the wage schedule was desired. The federation claims that this notification has not been sent this year and therefore the strike is a violation of the binding agreement of 1903.

It was stated to night that criminal action would be taken against the longshoremen today for a violation of the new law enacted at the last session of parliament and known as the Lemieux act. This makes it a criminal offence for any party to go on strike without first invoking arbitration or conciliation board, one member of which will be appointed by the contending parties and if these men cannot agree on a third course the same shall be appointed by the minister of labor. If these arrests take place it will be the first occasion since the enactment of the new law that a strike in port and today this number will be increased by two. Last night there was very little work going on and what there was, was being performed by the stewards and crews of the various boats which were happy to earn their thirty-five cents an hour, in addition to their regular pay as members of the crew.

**Mrs. Mary McNamara**

Mrs. Mary McNamara, widow of John O. McNamara, while picking up a piece of board in the yard of her home, 129 Marsh Road, Monday night about 7 o'clock, suddenly dropped to the ground and expired immediately. She was in her usual good health Monday and after supper she went out to the yard with the intention of tidying it. She stopped over to pick up a piece of board and as she did so she complained of a sudden pain in her heart. She sank to the ground, and as she seemed unable to get up, some bystanders ran under her assistance. It was then found that she was dead.

She was carried into the house and Dr. G. O. Baxter summoned. He could do nothing, however. He said that in his opinion the cause of death was neuralgia of the heart. Mrs. McNamara was well known in the district, and was a very highly respected. Her husband died a year ago, April 8. She is survived by three daughters—Miss Annie, May and Agnes, all at home, and there will be general sympathy for them in their sudden bereavement.

**PREMIER LAURIER'S PLAN FOR FAST ATLANTIC SERVICE**

Scheme for 25 Knot Steamers Between Canada and England.

Ottawa, May 13—Although nothing official is obtainable at the trade and commerce department, the prospects of a fast Atlantic service are brighter today than they have been for some years. With Sir Wilfrid Laurier working in behalf of it with the British government, and Sir Richard Cartwright favorable to it at this end there ought to be some definite information on the subject at an early day.

It is well known that Sir Wilfrid Laurier has been in communication with the acting premier, Sir Richard, upon the matter and that the outlook for this long delayed venture being an accomplished fact was never better. In the "dickering" which is going on, the C. P. R. is said to be included. The present is a good time to establish this service. The parties who have got the contract for the Australian mail service by the Suez Canal do not appear to fulfil the terms with the Australian government and mails could be brought by the new fast line on the Atlantic and Pacific across Canada with a 24-knot service in 27 days in all or five days better than the time now made with the Australian mail by the Suez route.

The present Canada-Australia steam service is very inefficient, there being no improvements since its inauguration. The journey from London to China by the Canadian route can be shortened by two days notwithstanding that the distance is longer than by the Suez route.

A fast Atlantic service would also draw from the American routes with reasonable assistance from the British government, and Canada willing, as she undoubtedly is, a fast Atlantic and fast Pacific service may be realized in the near future.

Montreal, May 13—(Special)—A special cable to the Montreal Star says: Sir Wilfrid Laurier will tomorrow lay before the imperial conference every prospect of its acceptance in principle before the present week is out a scheme of empire transport which has been authoritatively called the biggest proposal submitted to any British government for over 100 years. Sir Wilfrid refuses to discuss the question at the present stage but I am able to give the following outlines:

The proposal is for the immediate creation of an empire mail service of the highest speed and efficiency, to Canada and via Canada to New Zealand and Australia on the one hand, and to China and Japan on the other, the Canadian service to con-
