Trade with the island of Cuba for the last month reached a new record. The exports through the port for the month amounted to \$48,872.70.

The St. John customs receipts for the fiscal year ended March 31 last were \$3,256,699.57, a new record. In the previous year the sum was \$2,707,080.06.

Canada's customs receipts for the last month were greater than the previous month. The figures for March were \$15,209,118, which is the greatest in the history of the country. The year's total figures exceeded by \$43,338,096 that of last year. The total was \$145,949,107.

DIAMOND JUBILEE OF THE WATERLOO ST. UNITED BAPTIST CHURCH

Interesting Historic Facts in Connection With the Anniversary

The Waterloo Street Baptist church is soon to celebrate its 78th anniversary. From the diamond jubilee programme the following facts are gleaned:— This church was organized as the First Free Baptist Church of St. John, N. B., April 6th, 1842, at the home of Eben Lawson on Exmouth street, by Rev. Samuel Hart, with a membership of fifteen.

The growing congregation was ministered to from time to time by Rev. A. Taylor, J. G. Flanders, Edward Wayman, Abner Mersereau, William Pennington, and Benjamin Merritt. The frequent "calls" for the ministry of the church were generally occasions of revival.

Until 1847, services were held in private houses and halls, but in March of that year the erection of the present edifice was begun and was completed in November of the same year.

The first service was held in the vestry on November 18, 1847.

Ezekiel McLeod, a young member of the newly organized church, having heard the "call" for the ministry of the gospel was ordained November 6th, 1848. Later he became the founder and editor of "The Religious Intelligencer." His labors continued in the city and in Carleton were so owned and blessed of God that D. W. Clark was appointed deacon to look after the interests of the church. In later years these carefully nurtured interests resulted in the formation of the Waterloo street and Victoria street churches.

The Sunday school was organized April, 1848.

In January, 1850, the Rev. Joseph Deane was called to give pastoral oversight to this church, and the Rev. Ezekiel McLeod was called to become the first settled pastor. He accepted the call, and in this church, Rev. Jacob Hart was pastor for about six years, and was followed by the Rev. J. T. Parsons, whose able ministry in this church extended over a period of twenty-two years.

Rev. J. W. Clarke was pastor from 1861 to 1869.

Rev. J. Phillips was pastor from 1869 to 1894.

Rev. A. J. Prosser was pastor from 1894 to 1909.

Rev. Gideon Swin was pastor from 1907 to 1909.

Rev. F. H. Wentworth, the present pastor, commenced his ministry with this church December, 1909.

When the former Baptist and Free Baptist bodies were united, in 1906, this church became known as Waterloo Street United Baptist Church.

The electric light was installed January 5, 1913, the young men of the church, under the direction of Harmon Hoyt, freely giving their time and labor.

In 1912 pew rents were abolished and the duplex envelope system of raising money for church and denomination purposes was introduced.

Tea merchants who have shipments made to London are affected by the government measure, which provides for the taking over of forty per cent. of all arrivals, whether of fine or coarse quality, at one shilling a pound, for "certain uses."
