MEASLES SERUM EFFECTIVE Good Results of New Treatment Re-

Dr. Degkwitz, assistant attending physician at the Munich University Children's Hospital, recently published his observations on 172 children who were given injections of the serum of measles convalescents, writes the Berlin correspondent of the Journal of the American Medical Association. All the children who received the prophylactic injections of serum between the second and sixth day after the infection, proved immune to the disease. The serum was obtained by vein puncture, from seven to foured by vein puncture, from seven to four-teen days after convalescence, from child-ren who had gone through with uncomplicated measles. Mixed serums were prepared and such quantities of serum (usually from 3.5 to 4 cubic millimeters) as will protect a child of 8½ years against the disease, up to the fourth day of incubation, are designated a protec-

If insufficient quantities of serum are given at a certain time during incubation, the appearance of the disease is delayed and the symptoms are attenuated. The serum of adults, in large doses, does not delay the onset of the disease, but does attenuate it. Utilizing the results of Degkwitz's experiments, it is said to be possible by this method to prevent the spread of measles in foundling asylums, day nurseries, hospitals, etc.

According to the article, published by Professor Kleinschmidt, these observations have been confirmed by experiments conducted in Hamburg. Out of a total of sixty children given injections of serum on ten different occasions, ac-If insufficient quantities of serum ar of serum on ten different occasions, according to Degravita's method, one child came down, on the twentieth day of incubation, with abortive measies, and one with measles of an incomplete, questionable type. In the case of the first child the quantity of serum employed was too small.


