The Buffalo.

Latest statistics furnished through the Department of the Interior show that there are over 8,500 buffalo now in the park at Watnigwint, Alberta. In addition, there are nearly 100 elk, about 200 moose, a few antelope, approximately 400 mule deer, and nineteen caribou. The buffalo had at one time nearly disappeared.
