Higher Pay For Teachers In Fairville

At the adjourned annual meeting of the ratepayers of the Fairville school district held last night in Fairville school, A. W. Carten presiding, it was decided to grant an increase of salary to the teachers, \$100 a year to the female teachers and \$200 to the males, the increase totalling altogether \$1,975.

The meeting was well attended, James E. Bryant, secretary, read his report showing a total income of \$2,214.51, and a total expenditure of \$9,226.10, leaving a balance of \$90.11. H. M. Stout read the auditor's report which was adopted. Simon Brundshaw was elected to replace Stephen H. Shaw on the board of trustees. James E. Bryant, whose term had also expired, was re-elected.

A communication from the teaching staff was read asking that the female teachers be granted an increase of \$100 a year and the male teachers \$200 a year. After considerable discussion this was adopted and the trustees instructed to see that the teachers received the increase, totalling \$1,975.

The new warrant for taxes was placed at \$8,800. The matter of bonds outstanding was discussed. It was shown, that between 1920 and 1924 on motion it was decided that five per cent. of all taxes next year be set aside as a sinking fund for their redemption. It was also moved that arrangements be made with the bank of Nova Scotia for the trustees to borrow if necessary up to \$500 on an overdraft.

The meeting was very largely attended. It was the first annual meeting to be held in the evening and the idea was so generally approved that it was decided to ask the Inspector for authority to hold the annual meeting next year also in the evening.

Regarding compulsory attendance the question was left with the trustees to investigate and submit a report next year as to how the act may best be enforced.

Inspector William McLean was present and made valuable suggestions during the progress of the meeting. He announced that he would call a meeting very soon of the trustees of the four districts—Fairville, Milford, Randolph and Manawagonish road—to reconsider the arrangement of the school boundaries.

HARD COAL SUPPLY THIRTY PER CENT. SHORT

Want Federal Government To Build Wing

A movement is on foot to have the Federal government, in connection with its treatment of invalid soldiers, build a large wing on the open space in front of the General Public Hospital and a nurses' home on the hospital lot facing White street. The idea is that these additions should be taken over at the end of the war by the municipality under an agreement between the government and the hospital authorities. It is pointed out that by this arrangement much money would be saved to both the Dominion and the municipality. The expenditure would be for a permanent building, and the needs of the hospital for additional space would be met without any duplication of expenditure.

The feeling is that a large new wing of the number of stories required, as wide as the present wing of the hospital running parallel to the nurses' home and as long as might be thought advisable—the lot is large enough for a building of any size necessary—should be constructed by the government so soon as possible, and it is pointed out that after the war when the new wing would be largely solved as a result of the additional space provided for the hospital authorities. The new power house is large enough to meet the needs of such a new wing, and, in addition, the invalid soldiers would be near the provincial pathological laboratory. The ell now used as a nurses' home could be made available for the hospital staff, and the nurses would have the advantage of living in a modernly equipped home.

Offices would be provided in the centre of the old hospital building, where much space is now taken up by the staff and other rooms necessary in hospital work.

The medical men of the city are said to be strongly in favor of this idea, as well as several members of the municipal council. It is understood that the matter will be taken at once with the federal authorities and there would seem to be good reason to expect that something will come of it.
