Plans For and Facts About The World Baseball Series

FACTS ABOUT THE 1914 WORLD'S SERIES

Four games must be won by a club to decide championship.
First and second games—In Philadelphia, Oct. 9, 10.
Third and fourth games—In Boston, Oct. 12, 13.
Fifth game if necessary—In Philadelphia, Oct. 14.
Sixth game if necessary—In Boston, Oct. 15.

The umpires will be Klem and Byron of the National league and Dineen and Hildebrand for the American league.
There will be three official scorers, J. G. T. Spink of St. Louis and one man to be picked by the Philadelphia baseball writers and one by the Boston writers.

No change was made in the rules for playing world's series games. As heretofore, four games must be won by a club to claim the championship. In the event of a seventh game being necessary the toss of a coin after the sixth contest will decide whether the seventh shall be played in Boston or Philadelphia.

Philadelphia will have the honor of staging the first two games for the baseball championship of the world between the Philadelphia Americans and the Boston Nationals. They will be played on Oct. 9 and 10 at Shibe Park.

When it came to tossing the coin to decide where the first two games shall be played, Chairman Herrmann of the National Commission flipped a silver dollar and Mr. Gaffney called "tails." The coin dropped head up, and Connie Mack with a smile said "Philadelphia, 9 and 10."

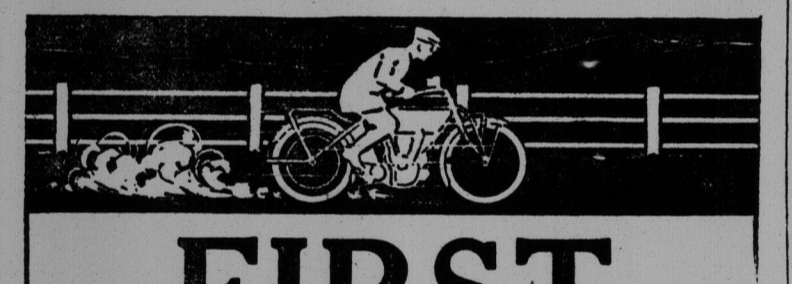

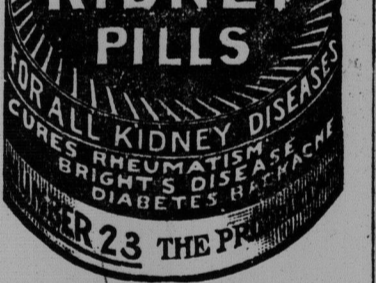
