Philadelphia, June 26-Bearing good cheer and doughnuts to convicts in penitentiaries from the Atlantic to the Pacific coast, a gospel car will leave here on July 7 with a party of welfare workers, some of whom helped brighten dark days for the soldiers in the trenches in France. On the front of the car will be a brass plate with the inscription "In the Service of the King."

The automobile tour was planned by some of the workers following a visit to a convict camp, where they made doughnuts for the men and talked and prayed for them. Their doughnut-making, with doughnut cutters made from captured German shells, and the appeal of their idea soon brought aid to them, and recently they were given a large automobile, fully equipped, in which to make their journey. The first five gallons of gasoline also was presented. 
