The estimates were brought down to the House on Tuesday afternoon. The estimated revenue for the year ending June, 1906, is put at \$2,559,376.66, as compared with \$2,522,076.66 estimated last year, and \$2,597,867.68 actually re-

The expenditure is estimated at \$2, 566,038.31, as compared with \$2,442-354.31 last year, and \$2,862,794.09 shown in the public accounts as having been actually expended. There is thus an estimated deficit o

\$6,661.65.

There are increases estimated under following heads: Land sales, \$20,-000; land revenue, \$70,000; timber royal-ties, \$75,000; timber leases, \$25,000; mining receipts in general, \$55,000; li-censes, \$15,000; marriage licenses, \$1,-000; tax sale deeds, \$100; registry fees, \$20,000; hospital for insane, \$3,000; in-
