ARCHBISHOP BOND DIED IN MONTREAL THIS MORNING

From Weakness Following a Stroke of Paralysis—The Grand Old Man of the Church of England—Canon Richardson's Tribute.

MONTREAL, Oct. 8.—Archbishop Bond, primate of all Canada, died at 6:30 a. m. today after a number of weeks of gradual sinking following a stroke of paralysis.

His grace was stricken with paralysis in December last while preaching in St. James the Apostolic church, and since then has never fully recovered, though he attended to the business, and though he did not preach again, he attended service two weeks ago.
