REPORTS AND DISASTERS.

Brownsville, Tex., Oct. 30.—The twelve sailors who were missing after str. Nicaragua (Mex), sank off Padre Island Oct. 16 have been rescued. The remainder of the crew was rescued after a search of several days.
Noboka, Oct. 30.—Str. Bay View, from Newport News for Boston, towing a barge Badger and Britannia, was ashore on Half Moon Shoal, but floated without assistance and proceeded.
Philadelphia, Oct. 30.—Tug Helen, owned by George W. Gormley, sank at Stokes Landing in Rancocas Creek, N. J., on the 29th; Frederick Egan, the cook, was drowned; it is thought the tug was caught by towline and careened and sank.
San Francisco, Oct. 24.—Whaling bark John & Winthrop, which arrived today from Fox Island, reports Sept. 8 experienced a heavy NNE gale and heavy sea; vessel sprang a leak astern, and was leaking at the rate of two feet an hour; had to pump continually to keep vessel free.

MARINE NOTES

SPRUNG ALEAK.
The schooner Lullia which put into this port last Wednesday from Little Bass River, N. S., leaking, is now being refitted and will proceed to New York with her cargo of lumber as soon as repairs are made.

SALVAGE PROBABLY BETTLED.

Negotiations have been pending between Pickford and Black and Lane and MacAndrews, the London owners of the steamer Lux which was wrecked on the coast of Nova Scotia, with a view to adjusting a settlement for salvage, to be divided equally between the local steamship company and the crew of the Boston.

WOODSTOCK TO HAVE AN UP-TO-DATE JAIL

Woodstock, Nov. 1.—Under a new arrangement the County Court in this county will sit on the second Tuesday in January, the first Tuesday in May and the fourth Tuesday in September.

Work is well advanced on the repairs to the county jail, which, when completed, will be along the lines of the Hamilton jail, and will render the building perfectly safe. There will be twelve steel cages, each 8 x 10 feet, placed on the concrete floor which will hold 24 prisoners. The work will be finished in about three weeks.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole possessor of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the "Homestead Lands Agency" or Sub-agency for a "Homestead Certificate" or "Provisional Certificate" of the land to be homesteaded. The certificate may be made at any time, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, or intending homesteader.

Duties—Must reside upon the homesteaded land for six months in each of six years from date of homesteaded certificate. (Including the time required to earn homestead patent.) Excluded fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has cultivated his homesteaded land and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead. (Including the time required to earn homestead patent.) Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.
