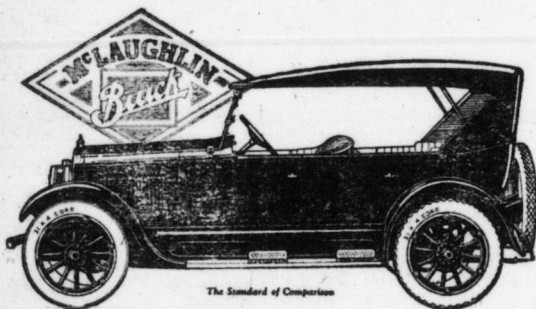

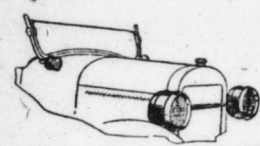

### ONTARIO HIGHWAYS

To the Editor of The Transcript:

No doubt you are already aware that the Talbot street in Elgin county has been widened at an enormous cost, and also that the Ontario Department of Highways intends widening the Longwoods road from sixty-six feet to eighty-six feet, and have plans under way for the work to be done this coming summer. The idea of widening 2,200 miles of highways designated in this province, the planting of ornamental trees, the buying of land and removal of already substantial fences and the building of new fences, and the extra cost of maintenance, is one of the most absurd and uncalled-for pieces of work ever undertaken in this province.

During the past winter propaganda work has been carried on throughout the province by the government. Meetings have been held at which several high-salaried officials, engineers, a forester and a motion picture machine endeavored to make the farmer believe that by widening and decorating the highway past his property he would shortly become a man of wealth. The average farmer doesn't seriously take to heart any such humbug—when he finds it impossible owing to hard times and high taxation to put any improvements on his own property.

The consumption of practically the whole output of the cement plants by the government on provincial highways has driven the price of cement to a height never equalled in this province before. The same can also be said of wire fence. As a consequence of these exorbitant prices agricultural improvements and developments have been seriously retarded.

After every assurance had been given the farmer at a meeting in Glencoe over two years ago that the highways would not be widened unless the property owner saw fit to donate his land willingly, now the farmer's land willingly, now the farmer's

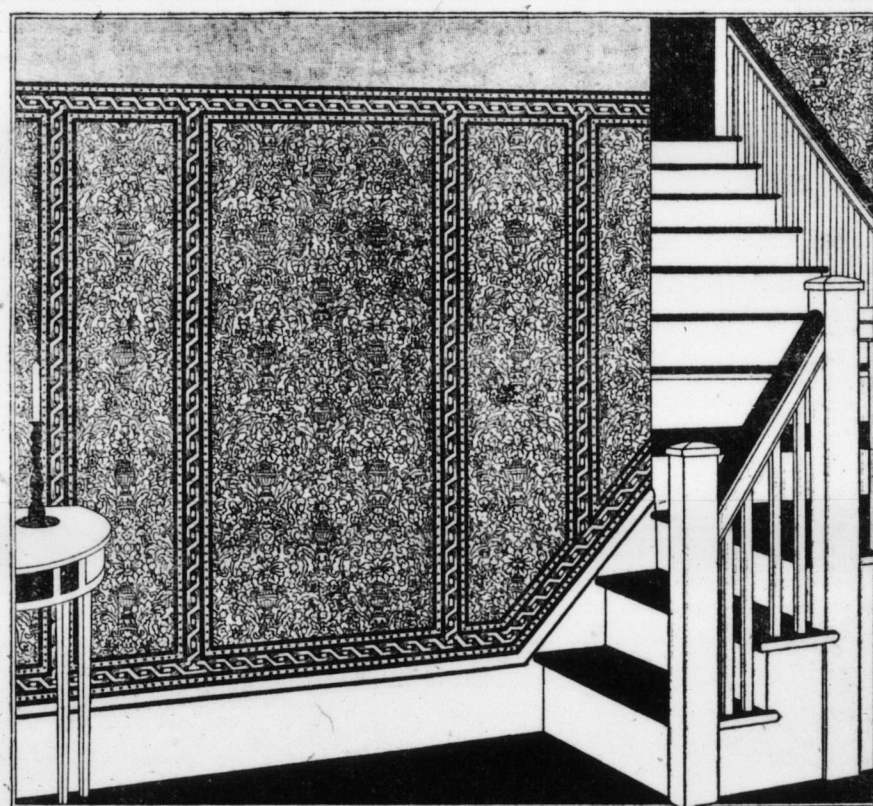
