NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the undersigned, and endorsed "Tender for the St. Lawrence Canals," will be refor the St. Lawrence Canals," will be re-ceived at this office, until the arrival of the eastern and western mails on Wednesday, the 23rd day of July next, for the construc-tion of a lift lock, weirs, etc., at Morrisburg, and the deepening and enlargement of the Rapide Canal. The work will be divided into three sections, each about a mile in length.

A map of the locality, together with plans and specifications of the respective works, can be seen on and after Wednesday, the 9th day of July next, at this office, and at the Resident Engineer, of Office, Morrisburg, where printed forms of tender can be obtained.

In the case of firms there must be at-tached to the tender, the actual signatures of the full name, the nature of the occupa-tion and residence of each member of the chartered bank in Canada for the sum of S6,000, must accompany the tender for Section No. 1, and an accepted cheque on a chartered bank in Canada, for the sum of

The respective accepted cheques must be endorsed over to the Minister of Railways and Canals, and will be forfetted if the party tendering declines entering into contract for the works at the rates and on the terms stated in the offer submitted. The cheques thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.
