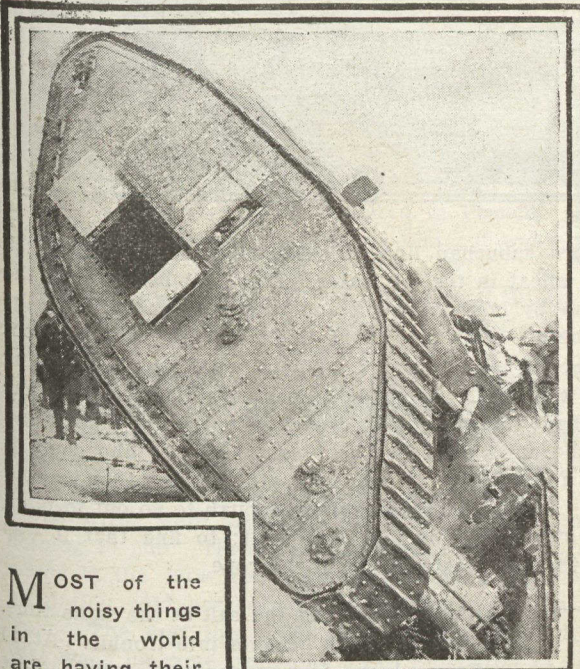


# VIOLENCE *and* VIBRATIONS



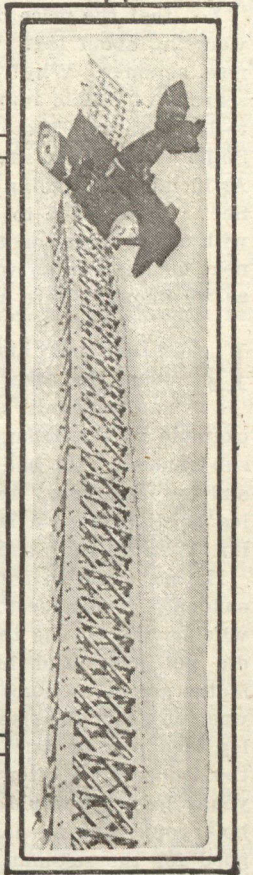
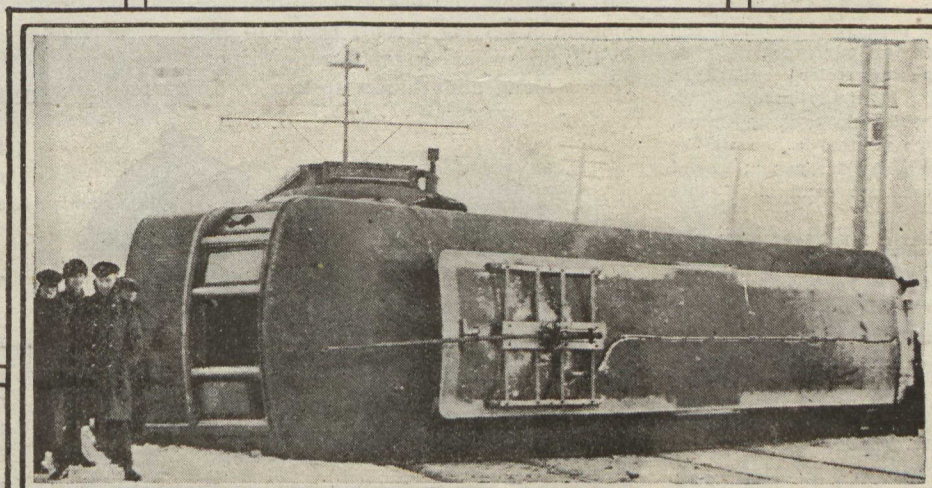
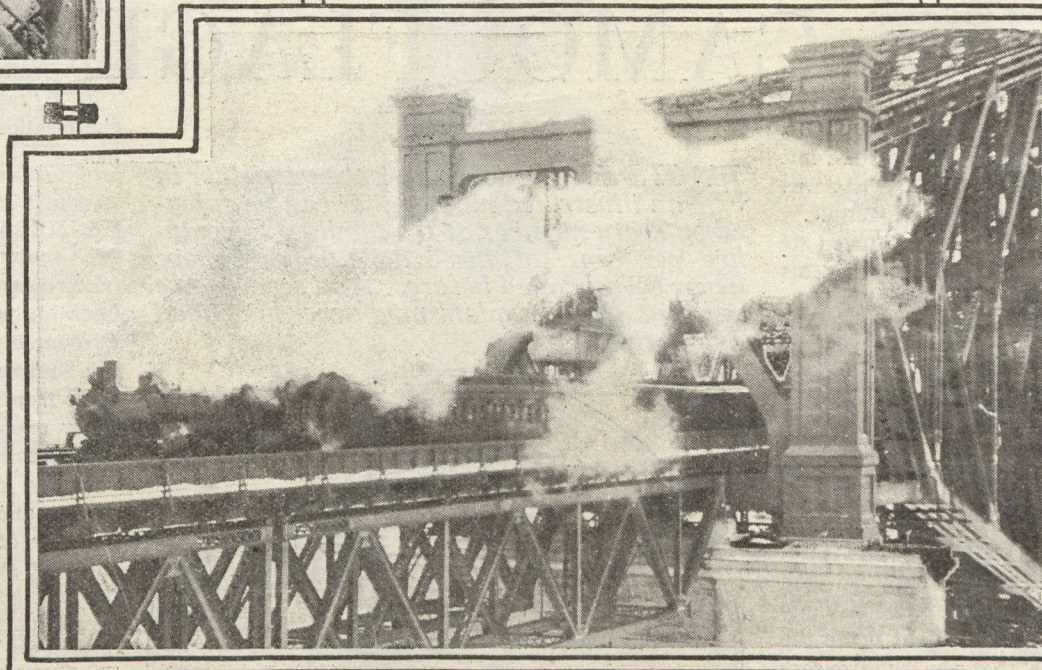
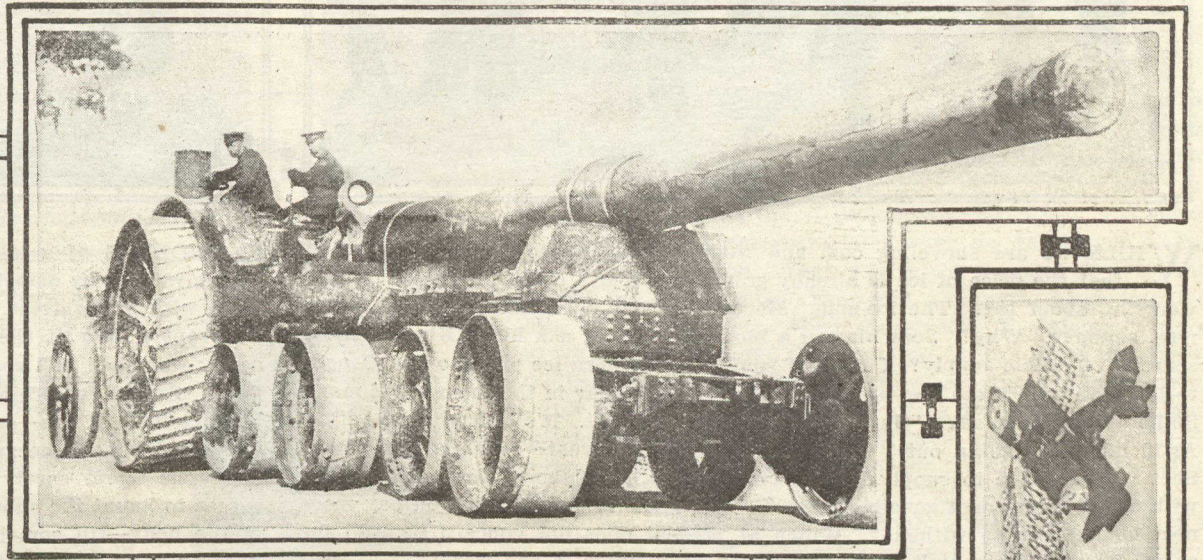
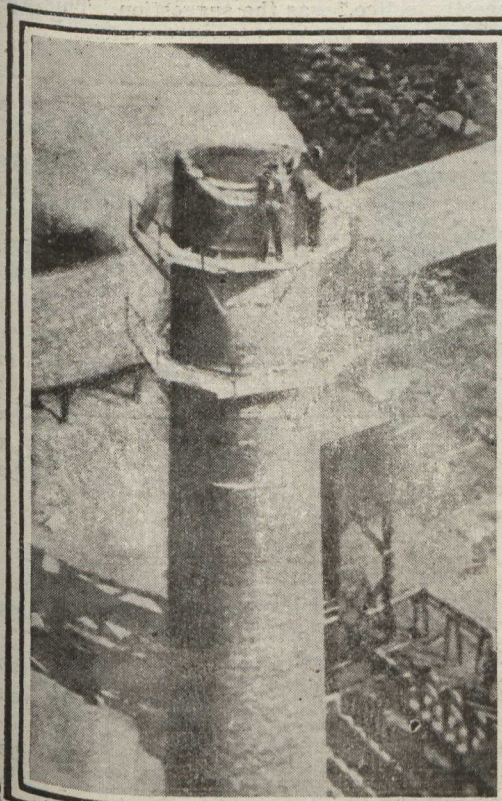
**M**OST of the noisy things in the world are having their innings now—just to show that all the great noises don't belong to nature.
