Mr. Amery's letter of May 10th, 1926
addressed to the Prime Minister

Considered as a whole, Mr. Amery's letter does not deal at all with the issues forced upon Canada by the Pacific Cable Board.

It is silent regarding these issues and ignores them. It is confined merely to a statement of what Mr. Amery previously proposed by cablegram should be done in the way of legislation to relieve the Pacific Cable Board from difficulties of its own creation, and it takes no more account of Canada's rights than the Board did.

To follow the lead of Mr. Amery's letter would mean merely that nothing at all would be done to recognize Canada's rights as a partner Government.
