I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 30th ultime, inclosing a petition from the Burnt Church Band of Indians, requesting removal of Chief and reporting trespassing by white people on Tabusintae the Reserve; also two letters from the Chief, Peter took, denying the report of the Indians respecting alleged trespass.

In reply I have to inform you that the Department is unable to determine whether, or not, the statements of Chief Sock are correct, without further information.

I have, therefore, to request you to visit
the Reserve and to make a careful examination, and report
the actual facts. If you find that timber has been out
and removed, you should ascertain by whom and when the
cutting was done.
