17. Merchant shipping losses for the quarter were either third or fourth lowest since the war began. In July 381,230 tons of Allied and neutral shipping were lost from all causes throughout the world, a relatively high total which, however, is belanced by the sinking of U-Boats. More U-Boats were sunk during July than merchant vessels sunk by U-Boats and in August the U-Boats fared even worse as can be seen from the following table:
