

Then brief outline of further references to Co-ordinating Committee, and finally, decision on Thursday to adjourn at the conclusion of Friday's meeting, to have plenary session on Monday.

Make clear the purpose of the plenary session, by prefacing it making mention in a general way of the proposals submitted. Make clear first how the Dominion proposals had been submitted in open conference. Some of the provinces had not presented theirs immediately. Indicate if possible how they were presented.

Then make clear that at the Co-ordinating Committee modifications were made in the federal proposals in the light of discussions.

Then further clarification of these proposals, but bring out that it was felt by some of the provinces that while the Dominion position had been given prominence in the press, the position of some of the provinces have not gained the same publicity.

It was therefore felt that the time had come when the Dominion and provinces alike should have the opportunity to present in public their proposals or attitude toward the Dominion proposals.

The brief might make clear from the outset that the Dominion proposals had been the basis of the discussion.

Some of the provinces had not presented any proposals. Consider wisdom of stating that Ontario had not up to the present.

Make clear that the Co-ordinating Committee discussions had not been for the purpose of concealing anything from the public, but rather for the purpose of permitting a freer discussion of everything on its merits than might have been possible in an open forum.

Then make very clear that the present open plenary session is to see that each government has the opportunity to state very definitely its position.

I would then follow with the statement of the Dominion's proposals mentioning where the fuller statements would be found and making clear that this statement is a consolidation of the Dominion's position up to date and

does not pretend to go into details.
