imagine it is around four or four and one-half pounds.

Q-362 Now this day of October 31st - oh, another thing before we go on with that. You have doubtless many friends in the Camp?

A-362 Yes, sir.

Q-363 You have friends in Camp

A-363 Yes, sir.

Q-364 Is it your practice to visit these friends?

A-364 The nights I don't go home.

Q-365 This night in question, October 31st, were you going to visit friends?

A-365 I was going over to see three or four of them.

Q-366 ho were they?

A-366 Well, one was a Private, named Bradley. He is out of there just now. He got a transfer. And McKinnon was another one.

Q-367 Where were they?

A-367 They had been transferred to "B" Company.

2-368 Where were their billets?

A-368 I cannot rememberthe name of the street. It is across from the Chinese restaurant.

Q-369 Can you point out on the map, for the benefit of the president and the Court, where the Chinese restaurant is?

BY THE JUDGE ADVOCATE:

2-370 The evidence has been that your car, on the night of October 31st, was parked there, where the R. Q. M. S. accosted you?

A-370 Is that Meade street (indicating)?

THE PRESIDENT: That (indicating) is Meade Boulevard, and the Sergeants' Mess is up here (indicating) and the main gate is here (indicating).

BY THE DEFENDING OFFICER:

Q-371 Where did McKinnon live
