B-69727 Cpl Andrews, W.V., C.P.C. on the strength of #1
C.R.C.P.U., attached to #1 Cdn Postal Tracing Unit, a soldier
of the Canadian Army Overseas, having been duly sworn, states :-

At approximately 0645 hrs one day last week I came to the
Orderly Room, 1 Cdn Postal Tracing Unit from the Breakdown section
with Cpl Wakelyn and Pte Wyton. CSM Myles was in the Orderly
Room and he asked Gnr Wyton to produce any cigarettes he had.
Gnr Wyton handed over one package, which I now recognize as
Exhibit "A", which had one cigarette missing. We checked the
package and found a cross marked inside of it with a coloured
pencil.

Questioned by officer detailed to take the Summary -

Question 1: Would you recognize Gnr Wyton if you saw him?
Answer 1: Yes sir!

Question 2: Do you recognize him?
Answer 2: Yes sir! Right there sir!

The accused declines to cross examine this witness.
