and wanted for a hunting ground. Klatsalkay was just west of Timber Limit No. 9 on Cooper Reach, Loughboro Inlet; forty acres was wanted there for a fishing and hunting station. At Samama, at the head of Beaver Creek, Loughboro Inlet, just west of T.L. 14647, forty acres was wanted for a fishing and hunting station; and at Homeno, 60 sores on the North side of Apple River, just east of the Island Power Company's Reserve No. Sufor a hunting and fishing station. At Ogwiltoia, Section 21, on Charlie Boy'. Mayne Passage, was wanted for a hunting and fishing station -- 60 acres. Tatoose Reserve was now in use by the Indians, one of them having a house and garden there. There was plenty of good timber there and good soil, also a large river in which many salmon ram. That Reserve was used by all the Bend.

MR. COMMISSIONER MACDOWALL, in closing the meeting announced that where lands applied for had already been alienated, the Commission might not be able to get them for the Indians, but due consideration would be given to the subject matter of all their several applications.
