BOTH AUTHOR and EDITOR were FAMOUS MEN. The first was an eminent cardinal, who studied theology under the celebrated FILLIPPO di NERI, at Rome, and whom he succeeded as superior of the congregation of the Oratory. He afterwards became confessor to Pope Clement VIII. SPONDE became Bishop of Pameers in 1626. The annals extend from A.D. 1 down to A.D. 1198. On the first cover will be found the autograph of GEORGIUS RHELBIVS of Studiorum, 1618.
