A CATHOLIC PASTOR PREACHES TO BAPTISTS.

We take the following from the Cincinnati Catholic Tribune, the organ of the colored Catholics of the United States. It says: Father B. W. O'Boyle, rector of St. Bernard's Church in Corning, O., delivered the following lecture at the Colored Baptist Church, in Rendeville, recently, at the invitation of the pastor and members of that Church. We can not now recall a similar incident in modern times where a Catholic priest, at the invitation of the pastor and congregation, occupied the pulpit of a Protestant Church. Following is the lecture:

"MY FRIENDS—It certainly appears strange to see a Catholic priest on a Sunday afternoon in a Baptist Church speaking to non-Catholics, and I am sure there will be many curious comments passed upon my action in coming among you this evening; but to me there are only a few things which appear to be very strange on this occasion: first of all, that we profess to be all followers of the same Divine Master, and have so many different churches; and so many conflicting beliefs.

"2d, That being a minister of the grand old Church in whose bosom the doctrines of Christianity have been so zealously guarded since the ascension of Christ into heaven, I should feel so long a stranger to you in religious intercourse while you and I are on the friendliest terms in our social surroundings; and finally the strangest feature of all is to find that all the colored men before me, with one exception, are non-Catholics!

"Your chains were cut to pieces and you were lifted up to the dignity of free men in the late war; but why, I ask you, when you looked upwards and around you at the end of the war, why did you not find yourselves Catholics? Why were you Baptists, Methodists, Presbyterians, any thing but Catholics? I answer, because the Catholic Church is the mother of liberty; because the Catholic Church never nurtured slavery, because the Catholic Church was unable to break through the barriers that Protestant slave owners drew around their persecuted race in the Southern States. You can therefore not be a stranger with the religion that your cruel masters possessed. But if the Catholic Church had her way the abominable and cursed traffic in human slavery could never have existed in this fair land of freedom. I claim therefore, my colored brethren, as a priest of that glorious old Church, which has ever been and ever will be the friend and fearless defender of the rights of the poor and the oppressed, that I am entitled to hear on your part; and that as candid, trustworthy and independent men, as men of free and unshackled intellects, as men prepared to any sacrifice to embrace truth whenever you can find it, as men of large, charitable, and generous hearts, you will listen to the claims which the Catholic Church puts forward in defence of her doctrine.

"You will seriously take up what doctrines she offers you and carefully examine the reasons and arguments on which their truthfulness rests, and if you find her claims to be just and her doctrines to be true you will not fear to embrace and profess them. I am not going to enter into detail on all or any of the Church's dogmas to-day. I am only giving you an introduction to what I trust you will eagerly listen to in lectures and instructions which I will be prepared to give you in the future.

"The Catholic Church invites every one to investigate the grounds of her doctrine. She teaches that faith must rest not on human judgment but on the truthfulness of God. A thousand human opinions cannot make one certainty, nor can the combined wisdom of all the people on earth and all the angels and saints in heaven be a sufficient reason for giving the assent of our intellect to the article of faith. The object of faith is the Word of God; the subject that receives this ob-

ject is the human intellect, and the reason why the intellect accepts the object is the truthfulness of God. From this you see how faith, which is the fundamental principle of the revealed religion of God, differs in the Catholic Church from faith in all other churches. The Catholic makes an act of faith by saying: 'My God, I believe all that Thou hast revealed, and whatever Thou teachest me by Thy Holy Church, because Thou art infallible truth and cannot deceive nor be deceived.' Outside the Catholic Church no such act of faith is possible, because there is no infallible guide acknowledged. The Holy Bible and private judgment, together with pious prayers for the proper interpretation and understanding of the inspired word, is all the foundation on which a non-Catholic rests his belief. Hence, in matters of doubt the most he can say is, 'My God, if this be the right meaning I have, in my judgment I firmly believe it; but if it be not the right meaning I do not believe it.'

"Now as it is with this great fundamental virtue and act of faith so it is with all the doctrines of the Catholic Church that grow out of faith. All stand out boldly and clearly defined before the eye of the intellect, and the mind of the Catholic beholding the stately and beautiful brightness of each revealed truth as it stands on the clear and solid foundation of God's own word falls down before, and with love and gratitude to God for having revealed it, embraces it with delight. Wherever the spirit of God reigns there also reigns freedom; but freedom cannot reign unless there is a law. It is not enough for freedom to have the shackles torn from their hands and feet; no, she must also have the dark walls of the prison of error thrown down and an untrammelled pathway for her intellect, leading out into the boundless plains and into the pure refreshing atmosphere that is forever illumined and invigorated by the Sun of God's truth.

"You shall know the truth," exclaims the Apostle, "and the truth shall make you free." The truth is free to grow and decay; the grass is free; the flowers and vines and all that grow are free; the streams and rivers run free; the lakes, seas and waves, the winds and clouds and all the wondrous objects that roll above our heads proclaim their liberty; and yet all things in nature, while truly free, are subject to laws which guide them onward in perfect order and harmony.

"From harmony, from heavenly harmony this universal frame began."

"Then why should not man, who is made to the likeness of the Creator of all, be absolutely free both in body and mind? Free from civil slavery, free from intellectual slavery—free in the ways of holiness and truth.

"My dear colored brethren, the Catholic Church can alone show you wherein the true glory and greatness of your race may be found. The highest dignity under heaven, in eyes of Catholics, is the dignity of the priesthood; and the highest place of honor, the most glorious monument that the Catholic Church can build to the memory of her heroes is when the place of their repose on her altars and their names on the roll of her saints. And this she has done with Catholic heroes of your own race who died in the order of sanctity. But why is it that so many millions of your race have deserted? Why is it that I am here to night to force you by the clearest arguments to look, at least with some degree of favor, on her saving doctrine?

"I answer, because you have been led astray by false teachers, by lying tongues and knavish politicians; because you have been fascinated with the virus of slander and calumny.

"Take, for instance, some of the charges made against the Church of Rome. We are called idolaters, ignorant, priest-ridden dupes, holy water fanatics, materialists, and so on. Well look at these pictures of the Baptist Church. Why have you all these accusations from the Bible? Is it to bow down and adore them? O, no. They are as true as the stars in the firmament of heaven, and as true as the understanding that while you and your children contemplate the picture you may the more easily meditate on its prototypes. That is what we do. Why, then, do you accuse us for what you practice yourselves? You support your preachers, and you do the same. Why say that we are priest-ridden? You charge us with paying for the forgiveness of sins. I tell you that if any priest were guilty of this enormous crime he would be forever degraded and deprived of his priestly office. You find fault with water poured blessed by prayers to God. Well your Bible, which lies before me, can tell you that Christ used clay and spittle in the case of the deaf man; the pool of water which the angel touched cured the sick, and when Moses approached the mount he had cast the shoes from off his feet because the very ground itself on which he stood was holy! But what of the charge of materialism? (Here the speaker opened the Protestant Bible and read from the Gospel of St. Luke the history of the incarnation and proved in the clearest manner from the sacred text that the same Divine Person who is the Son of God, is also the Son of the Blessed Virgin.)

"Tell me how you can dishonor the Mother without dishonoring the Son? Why mock your Catholic brethren for using the words of an archangel? But I will not believe that you do not honor her whom God so highly honored. From her the sacred humanity of Jesus Christ was drawn, from which the living streams of blood flowed down the cruel cross for man's redemption! And when all nature shrieked and set forth a wail of agony, when the veil of the temple was torn in twain, when the earth shook to its centre and the gaudy form of the dead rose up from the graves; oh, who is it that stands steadfastly by the cross in the midst of this horrid confusion? Who is it that withstands the shock that comes to nature, as if in the throes of death, to tremble? Let St. John, the faithful witness, the beloved disciple of our

Divine Lord, answer, 'There stood by the cross of Jesus His Mother!'

Several other points of Catholic doctrine were handled, and the speaker having thanked them for their close attention, hoped that he would soon have another opportunity of addressing them. He requested them to write out any objections they had against the Catholic Church and send them to him so that he could clear them up when they meet again.

Referring to their attitude of embracing the true faith, he said: "By nature you prove yourself to have a wonderful capacity for spiritual life. Your love for music your charming melodies that touch the tender chords of the human heart; the childlike simplicity that is so prominent a feature in your devotion, your brotherly love for one another, especially in sickness and distress; your temperate habits and joyful disposition, all this goes to prove that God had destined you for that high state of which Our Lord spoke when He said: 'Suffer the little children to come to Me for of such is the kingdom of Heaven.'"
