Stocks of wheat the world over are increasing, and it is probable that the hig demand which has been experienced during the closing months of last year may cease soon, in which event prices might work quite a few cents lower. However, we do not look for much change in prices for the next month, but would not be surprised should the market decline some during March and April.

Outs —Outs have been very steady, and are quite in demand all the time. Stacks are not accumulating at the terminals, and we do not think they will. We look for good prices to continue for the out rop.

Flax.—Flax has been erratic as usual, and as this is a grain which fluctuates very rapidly, an opinion on the market is useless.
