EDITORIAL NOTES.

The war in South Africa is now on a different footing. The Boers in Natal who had been raiding south of Ladysmith and threatening Pietermaritzburg are now on the march northward again. Communication by wire is open from Estcourt to Durban again. The British relief army is now near Estcourt and repairing the railway as they go. At Ladysmith all is well and the troops there will soon be able to assume aggressive work. General Buller is with the relief army at Natal. On the west side of the Orange Free State General Methuen has been busy with his troops and has fought two battles with the Boers, one at Belmont and the other at Gras Pan, in both of which the British drove off the Boers at the point of the bayonet. The Boers are travelling northwards. General Methuen's army is within forty miles of Kimberley and has news that all is well in the town. The casualties at the battle of Gras Pan on the British side are reported to be 26 killed and 171 wounded. Boer losses not known, but believed to be heavy.

General Gatacre's army is on the border of the Free State and fighting is expected soon at Colesburg and Stormburg and other points in that vicinity. The Boers have no relish for fighting at close quarters but they manage to do a good deal of damage before the British get within bayonet reach. There seems to be a want of cavalry and heavy artillery at present among the British. This will soon be remedied as the transports are nearly due with both on board. The latest news from Mafeking is that Col Baden Powell was still holding out and inflicting a great deal more damage on the Boers than he was receiving from them. He is the ideal commander so far on the British side, and has withstood a very hard siege with a small garrison. He keeps his men in constant training and ready for business at all hours on the shortest notice.

General Methuen fought his third battle with the Boers at Modder River on the 28th. It was the most stubbornly contested battle yet fought, and lasted ten hours, resulting in the Boers being driven from their position.

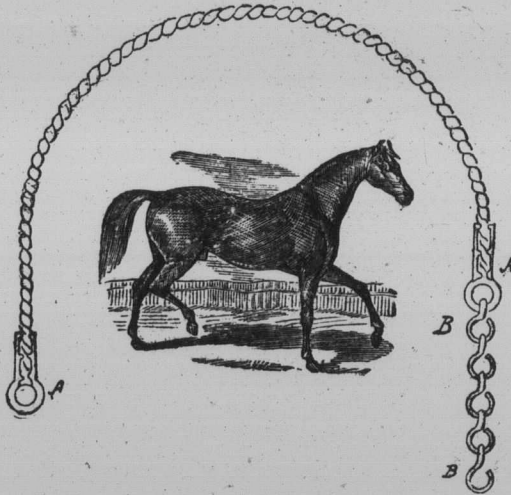
