Guthrie, Okla., April 4 - Another sensation was sprung today in connection with the recent legislature in that an important memorial to congress, passed unanimously by both houses and ordered engrossed, has sly disappeared. It is in possible to locate it in any way. The memorial was lathered by Representative Dyke Ballinger of Caddy county, and called for the refunding by the government to the three counties formed of the Kiowa-Comanche reservation the residue of the town lot; fund received by the government for the sale of lots in these counties at the time they were opened for settlement. The amount involved is about \$000,000. The money has been held by the government for the use of the counties in making permanent improvements. Now that the countie are securely organized the memorial asked that the moneys be refunded. The memorial never reached the governor for his signature.
